Ocean View, Simon's Town, Capricorn. He practices "Unconditional Feeding" for hundreds of people per day – **Seven days a week!!** This NPO -No: 246-295 does amazing work as the stories below, taken from Face Book , will tell – and far more poignantly than I can.... Read on



*1. **Awesome time spent with our homeless family today in Simon's Town. We watched the game together, we cheered together, we celebrated together and then ate together. At the Father's House program, there is no rich or poor, there is no Black, Indian, Coloured or White, we are all united for a common purpose, and with a common vision. Thank you to all who supported us continue to support us***

*2. **My Father's House** has been sending food to Capricorn daily, least did we know the circumstances being experienced there. Today, 6 soldiers from MFH and I spent some time with the children and adults there. The liquid on the street was not water from a spring but from sewerage/blocked drains. As painful as it was to see, even more painful, was seeing barefooted children walking and running on it. The need is great and poverty rife. We used to be pleased with our efforts of feeding between 100-200 children. Our contribution is a drop in the ocean. We handed out food, soap, toothpaste, sanitary towels, fruit and sweets. We were expecting 100 children but as the word got around, it turned to 200 then 300 then..... Our prayer and vision are to feed MORE children in Capricorn, ALL if possible. Pastor Thomas is doing a great job transporting the food to Capricorn, however, we think it is time to open a kitchen in Capricorn so that we can feed 400 + children. What are your thoughts? MFH Kitchen is certainly not area bound, we can do this!*
