Anthea Williams joined CWS in 2019. She is the Treasurer and is also a member of the Ocean View Ladies cycling

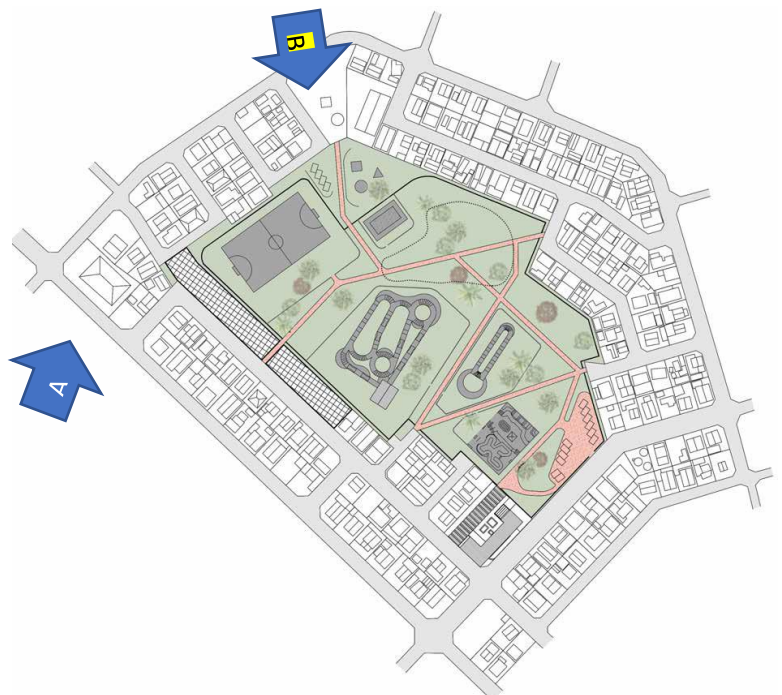


The club currently uses the cycling tracks on the grounds of Ocean View High, but their dream is to have their own place which will allow for expansion of facilities and membership growth.
