The Tembo Mentors will be joined by the crew from SUBS Robotics FLL/FTC Hub for a weekend of exploring nature and sharing knowledge about conservation and robotics



Mentors to ensure a weekend of skills and knowledge sharing to encourage a cross-pollination of ideas to tackle local environmental issues and robotics.

The **SUBS Robotics Hub** stands to serve the people to be future science & technology leaders by engaging in exciting mentor-based programs that build the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) learning communities with cutting edge activities.

The Chacma Champions Holiday Programme is <u>a 3-day overnight camp</u>, which encourages students to become *Champions for the Chacmas* and their environment. Students are introduced to different habitats and, using the Chacma baboons, are shown that nature is intricately connected, and that no habitat thrives in isolation. The students learn that our choices have consequences, and that these choices give us the power to help the environment, and working together, across communities, come up with simple solutions for waste management and minimising urban attractants for wildlife. Students study wetland micro-habitats, the fynbos biome, the riverine ecosystem, and explore the rocky shore where they will also carry out a beach clean-up. *Chacma Champions* learn about baboon life and troop dynamics and discover more about the important roles that these ecosystem engineers play in the unique and incredibly biodiverse fynbos biome. Attendees gain environmental knowledge and a deeper understanding of our impact on the environment. There are also art and poetry competitions, guest speakers and nature meditation to encourage our reconnection with the natural world, thus contributing to an environmental awareness campaign to amplify the voice of change.
